## New Quotas for Chocolate, Sugar Confectionery and Biscuits

The European Union (EU) Regulation 2015/50 was published in January 2015 (with effect from July 2014), amending Annex I to Council Regulation (EC) No 32/2000 regarding the introduction of new Community tariff quotas for chocolate, sugar confectionery and biscuits.

Regulation 2015/50 is binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
